## CURRICULUM

Students graduating from Hanford High School must accumulate a minimum of 21.5 credits. One-half credit equals successful completion of one semester class. Hanford High graduates must also complete certain courses prescribed by the State Board of Education and the Richland School District. The required subjects are as follows:

Language Arts (4); Social Studies (3); Science (2); Mathematics (3); Physical Education (1.5); Occupational Education (1); Fine Arts (1); Consumer Economics (.5); Health (.5)

## AP AND HONORS CLASSES

AP courses offered in English Language and Composition, English Literature and Composition, U.S. History, U.S. Government and Politics, World History, Art History, Biology, Physics 1 & C, Statistics, Chemistry, Environmental Science, Calculus AB & BC, Spanish, Spanish Literature, Human Geography, Studio Art and Psychology, and Computer Science. Honors courses are available in Language Arts 9, Language Arts 10, Geometry 9, Algebra 2, Pre-Calculus and Human Anatomy.
